

# **Bob Borkowski, DDS, MS, PA**

## **Plano, TX**

Dr. Bob Borkowski was raised in Southern Illinois and attended college at Westminster College in Fulton, Missouri, receiving his Bachelor's degree in 1969. He was graduated in 1973 from Georgetown University School of Dentistry and served in the U.S. Navy for three years, after which he returned to Georgetown for his Orthodontic residency. Immediately after receiving his degree in Orthodontics, in 1978, he began teaching at Georgetown and became Associate Clinical Professor and Director of Orthodontic Undergraduate Studies. He became board certified in 1989.

Dr. Borkowski has lectured throughout the U.S., Europe, Mexico and Asia. He has lectured on temporomandibular dysfunction, Lingual appliances, Herbst and Twin Block appliances, electromyography and numerous other topics coincident to progressive Orthodontic techniques. He currently is focusing on bony response to the use of ultra low continuous forces, a topic that grew out of research done in preparation of his master's thesis on Root Resorption in the late 70's and brought him to lecture extensively on the Damon Bioefficient system, in Europe, the U.K. and Asia.

Dr. Borkowski has served as president of the Southern Maryland Dental Study Club and the Georgetown Orthodontic Alumni Foundation, and is a member of the American Dental Association, Texas Dental Association, Dallas County Dental Society, the American Association of Orthodontists, the Southwestern Society of Orthodontists, and the College of Diplomates of the American Board of Orthodontics.
